September 4— Family Day

Today is the 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time. What do you think Jesus is trying to tell us in the gospel (Matthew 18:15-20)? Is He wanting us to tattle and gossip about others? Or is He asking us to gather together as one group and worship in His name? How hard is it sometimes to not run and tell someone's secret? Next time you find yourself in this situation of wanting to tell something when you know you should not, try to remember WWJD? As a family, play a game of telephone. Whisper a message in one person's ear, then they whisper what they heard to the next person until the final person says out loud what they have heard. This shows how mixed up a message can get when it is spread from person to person.

September 5—Labour Day

The first Monday in September is known as Labour Day. It is a day set aside to pay tribute to working men and women. It has been celebrated in both Canada and the United States since 1894. Pray one Our Father for all those who work including parents. teachers, students and volunteers. Spend this last day of freedom together doing something you love!

September 11 - Family Time

Today is the 24th Sunday in Ordinary time. The gospel reading (Matthew 18: 21-35) speaks about forgiveness and the importance of both being forgiven and forgiving others. As well, in the first reading we are told, "*Forgive your neighbour's* today's gospel. Would you have reacted in the *injustice: then when you pray, your own sins will be* same way; asking for more money because you forgiven." (Sirach 28:2) Has someone ever forgiven you for something - how did it feel? Think about the last time you went to confession and how at peace you felt afterward. Sometimes it is hard to forgive when you feel hurt. The sadness and anger will stay with you until you let go of those feelings and forgive the person who hurt you. Whenever you find it hard to love someone, take time to pray and ask for God's help. Celebrate the first week of school by planning a family dinner or a picnic after Mass. Enjoy these last few days of summer by being outdoors together.
