





Purpose

Used to identify a thing or person

Example Words

pen, dog, work, music, town, London, teacher, John

Example Sentences

This is my <u>dog</u>. He lives in my house. We live in London.





doing word

Purpose

To identify an action or state

Example Words

(to) be, have, do, like, work, sing, can, must

Example Sentences

I <u>love</u> singing. I <u>must</u> remember to <u>sing</u> every day.





Pronoun



of a noun

Purpose

Used to replace a noun to make writing more interesting

Example Words

I, you, he, she, some

Example Sentences

Silvia is Italian. She is beautiful.





Purpose

Used to precede or modify a noun to provide greater detail


Example Words

a / an, the, some, good, big, red, well, interesting

Example Sentences

A <u>shiny</u> wand sat beside the wizard's tall hat.





Preposition



Describes the relationship between two objects

Purpose

Links a noun to another word

Example Words


to, at, after, on, but, above, below, beside, about

Example Sentences

The bridge lay <u>over</u> the river.







Purpose

Joins clauses or sentences or words

Example Words

and, but, when

Example Sentences

I like dogs <u>and</u> I like cats. I like cats <u>and</u> dogs. I like dogs <u>but</u> I don't like cats.





Interjection



Used to add emotion

Purpose

Short exclamation, sometimes inserted into a sentence

Example Words


oh!, ouch!, Hi!, well

Example Sentences

Ouch! That hurts! Hi! How are you? Well, I don't know.







about a verb

Purpose

Describes a verb, adjective or adverb

Example Words

quickly, silently, well, badly, very, really

Example Sentences

My dog eats <u>quickly</u>. When he is <u>very</u> hungry, he eats <u>really</u> quickly.
